How Does Carpooling Work?

There are two types of carpool arrangements:

- Carpoolers can use one car owned by one driver. The riders and driver agree to an amount paid periodically to the driver, to cover operating costs for the daily commute.
- 2. Carpoolers can rotate car use so that each person's vehicle and driving time is shared equally with no money being exchanged.

Carpooling can be as simple as two employees or neighbors who live near one another sharing the ride to work on an informal basis. Employers can assist in the formation of carpools by matching employees who live near each other into groups that may be able to share a ride. Employers can encourage carpooling through incentives including preferred parking or reward programs.

- Reduces air pollution
- Reduces traffic congestion
- Alleviates commuter stress
- People who carpool may be eligible for discounts on their auto insurance







Tips For Successful Carpooling

Determine Your Route And Schedule.

Establish the morning pickup points and designate a place to meet for the trip home.

Delegate Driving Responsibilities.

If members of your carpool alternate driving, decide if you will alternate daily, weekly, or monthly.

Consolidate Driving Expenses.

If all members of your carpool do not share driving equally, establish how the costs will be shared.

Be Punctual.

Decide how long the driver is expected to wait at pickup points and respect the schedule.

Establish Policies.

Discuss smoking, music, food and drinks in advance to avoid possible irritants and conflicts.

Make Carpooling Serve Its Purpose.

Carpooling is for commuting to and from work, do not let it become a shopping or errand service.

Employers can save a substantial amount of money by reducing the number of parking spaces required for employees.

Increased Productivity And Morale.

Employees who carpool suffer from less commute-related stress, resulting in improved morale and productivity.

Tax Considerations.
