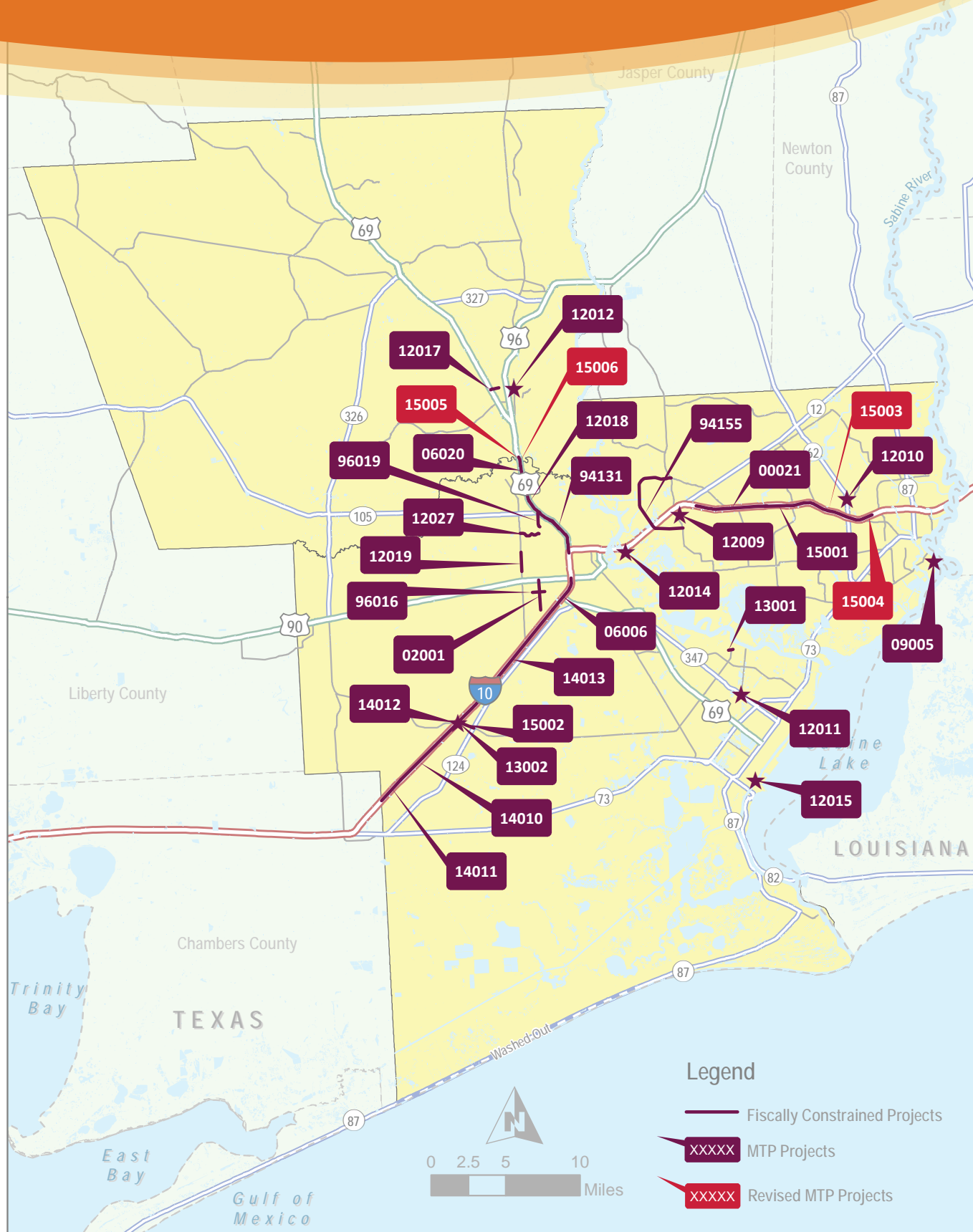

Tigers thump district rival Cards

■ Dontre Thomas, Adonis Thomas score 5 touchdowns in first-quarter.

The Tigers spoiled Bridge City's senior night celebration at Larry B. Ward stadium on Oct. 30, defeating the Cardinals 62-42 to set up a district championship showdown with Jasper in next week's regular season finale.

The balanced offensive attack of quarterback Dontre Thomas and running back Adonis Thomas combined for five first quarter touchdowns to lead the Tigers (7-2, 4-1) to a 35-14 halftime lead.

Adonis scored on back-to-back touchdown runs of 20 and two yards in the first quarter, while Dontre connected with Kalon Barnes from nine and 24 yards out before scoring another with his feet on a six-yard scramble.

Cayce Draper got Bridge City on the scoreboard first with a nine-yard score and Cardinal quarterback Camden DuBois, who was picked off twice by Silsbee's Vestin Ayera, connected with Cole Poole on a 22-yard touchdown in the second quarter.

A 20-yard rushing touchdown by Adonis gave Silsbee their first lead of the night at 14-7. On the ensuing kickoff, a fumble was recovered by the Tigers on the Bridge City 8-yard-line. Two plays and 21 seconds later, Adonis added his

second touchdown of the game to give Silsbee a 22-7 advantage in the opening quarter.

With Bridge City (6-3, 3-2) nipping at their heels in the fourth quarter down 14 points, the senior quarterback scrambled from eight yards out and before he was tackled and his knee touched the ground at the two-yard-line, he pitched to Adonis. The sophomore running back would stroll in the end zone to extend the lead to 41-21.

Title game

Although there are no official district title games, the final Week 11 matchup in District 10-4A-1 will crown the champion.

Jasper (6-3, 5-0) will travel Friday to Silsbee (7-2, 4-1) to try and secure a second straight district title. The Tigers can claim their first district title since 2009 as a member of District 21-3A. But a loss could potentially drop them to the No. 4 seed behind Bridge City and

Huffman-Hargrave. Silsbee defeated Bridge City Friday 62-42 but lost to Hargrave 50-47 earlier this season. The Cardinals defeated the Falcons 41-34 in Week 9. Bridge City faces Splendora (0-5) next week while Hargrave takes on Little Cypress-Mauriceville.

LC-M (2-3) could advance as the district's No. 4 seed if it defeats Hargrave.

WEST ORANGE-STARK 48, HARDIN-JEFFERSON 0

WO-S overwhelms H-J Hawks

Behind an offense firing on all cylinders and a defensive unit that proved to be too much, the West Orange-Stark Mustangs defeated the Hardin-Jefferson Hawks 48-0 Oct. 30 to clinch its fifth consecutive district championship under head coach Cornel Thompson.

"This is the goal we set out to accomplish in the second phase of the season," Thompson said. "You know, after we finished with non-district. To be able to win our district again is a great feeling. It makes all of

the hard work, the sacrifice and bumps and bruises we had during those hot days worth it."

Mustangs quarterback Jackson Dallas was spectacular, completing 17-of-19 passes for 298 yards and three touchdowns.

"Jack threw the ball really well," Thompson said. "He did a good job of reading his keys. He's very intelligent and he doesn't get rattled easily."

Jackson threw touchdown passes to three different receivers: Thomas Wallace, with 3 receptions for 96 yards, Blake Robinson, 3

receptions for 37 yards and Jaylen Matthews, 2 receptions for 3 yards.

But according to Thompson, none of the offensive success would be possible if it wasn't for the dominant play of its offensive line.

"Look, we have to give the offensive line all of the credit in the world," Thompson said. "They did a great job of protecting Jack. In the beginning of the year, we were trying to find offensive linemen to start and I feel like they are beginning to come together. We know that we are only going to go as far as they take us."

The Mustangs' defense was equally impressive, as they held the Hawks to 143 yards of total offense en route to posting the 98th shutout in school history.

"We are undersized defensively," Thompson said. "But we have great quickness."

In the losing effort for the Hawks, Cole Priddy led their rushing attack with 66 yards on 20 carries, while Moreaux had 45 yards on 13 carries and Talon Tiley had 20 yards on 8 carries.

coach Carey Bailey.

Bailey and Abbott quickly grew close. It became apparent that the 330-pound couch potato was long gone.

Abbott admits the first season wasn't easy because he struggled with Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), but Bailey was always there for him, especially when Abbott's counselor moved away.

"He knew what he wanted when he came here," Bailey said. "I'm 46 years old and I've seen a lot, but what he brought to the table was something I've rarely seen."

Abbott, who's in his red-shirt freshman season, has

been coy with his teammates about his military past and the Purple Heart.

Abbott, whose uncle is also a Purple Heart recipient, estimates about half the team knows he was in the Army and even fewer teammates know about the Purple Heart.

That's fine by Abbott, who is just trying to keep up with teammates who were still in elementary school when he joined the Army.

"These have been the hardest years of football of my life," Abbott said.

"But I'm 27 years old and playing with these young guys. All of my buddies are home with their families and kids and that's great, but I don't believe that's where

I'm supposed to stop at yet," Abbott said.

Before Lamar's September game against Baylor, Woodard showed Abbott and the Cardinals the opening scene from the movie "Saving Private Ryan," when the American soldiers storm Normandy Beach.

It's an apt metaphor for Abbott's progress, which Lockett has seen through Abbott's Facebook posts.

"He set his goals and stuck with them," Lockett said. "I'm very proud of him for that. I told him I wanted an autographed jersey one day, because he's going to do big things."

Abbott is currently fighting a turf toe injury, but it hasn't fazed him.

"When I'm having a tough day at football," Abbott said. "I look at the Purple Heart and I know it's been so much worse. I could be sitting in the desert in 130 degrees while carrying around 100 pounds of gear, so this isn't so bad."

Even before the injury, Abbott hadn't seen the field much. But he still wakes up every morning with the same mentality.

"I love Lamar football," Abbott said. "I'll do anything for this program. For me to walk out of that with just a concussion and four years later I'm playing college football, that's a blessing."

LUMBERTON 28, VIDOR 13

Raiders clinch postseason berth

Lumberton used three long touchdown runs in the second quarter to pull away from Vidor and then hung on for a 28-13 win to clinch a postseason berth for the first time since 2008.

The backfield duo of Tim Rhodes and Caleb Thomas shredded Vidor's defense for 353 rushing yards and a pair of touchdowns each before halftime.

Lumberton set the tone early, overcoming three penalties on its opening drive thanks to 91 rushing yards by Rhodes and a 4-yard touchdown run by Thomas.

In the second quarter the Raiders took advantage of a pair of Vidor turnovers and scored three touchdowns within the span of four offensive plays to take control.

Rhodes burst through for touchdown runs of 69 and 63 yards on back-to-back carries, and then just 17 seconds after his second touchdown, Thomas broke off a 33-yard touchdown run of his own.

"On both plays, all I can say is I got the ball and I saw the hole," said Rhodes. "All I had to do was beat the safety. I was basically able to go untouched. I give the credit to my offensive line and fullback."

TURNING POINT: After yielding a touchdown on Lumberton's first drive, Vidor's defense briefly stiffened, easily stopping the Raiders on three straight possessions.

But the Pirates offense sputtered badly for the first 18 minutes, and after Rhodes' first breakaway touchdown, Vidor quarterback Kolbie Humble threw an interception that led to Rhodes' second touchdown. Vidor then fumbled the

ensuing kickoff, paving the way to Thomas' lengthy burst. Those mistakes sealed Vidor's fate, eliminating the Pirates from playoff contention.

"When I saw in the second quarter that we could physically handle them, that made a big difference, and then a couple turnovers were big, too," said Lumberton coach Chris Babin.

MOST SPECTACULAR PLAY: Rhodes broke through an opening and cut left to the sideline to create space on his 69-yard touchdown run. He outran most of the Vidor secondary, but needed one final block from Thomas deep in Vidor territory.

Sprinting parallel to Rhodes, Thomas delivered a wipout block that made it easy for his backfield mate to score.

"We were talking about how their defense was giving 110 percent, so in the huddle I said to Tim 'We've got to make something happen,'" said Thomas. "When I saw (the Vidor defender) coming, I said 'No way he's going to tackle (Rhodes)' so I just laid out and took him out."

Rhodes reached the 100-yard mark midway through the first quarter and briefly surpassed the 300-yard mark before being tackled a less of four yards on his final carry of the game. He finished with 297 yards on 26 carries and two touchdowns.

Thomas also scored a pair of touchdowns and reached 100 yards by halftime, finishing with 129 on 15 carries.

NEXT UP: Friday, Lumberton (7-2, 4-2) closes the regular season by visiting Nederland. Kickoff is at 7 p.m.
