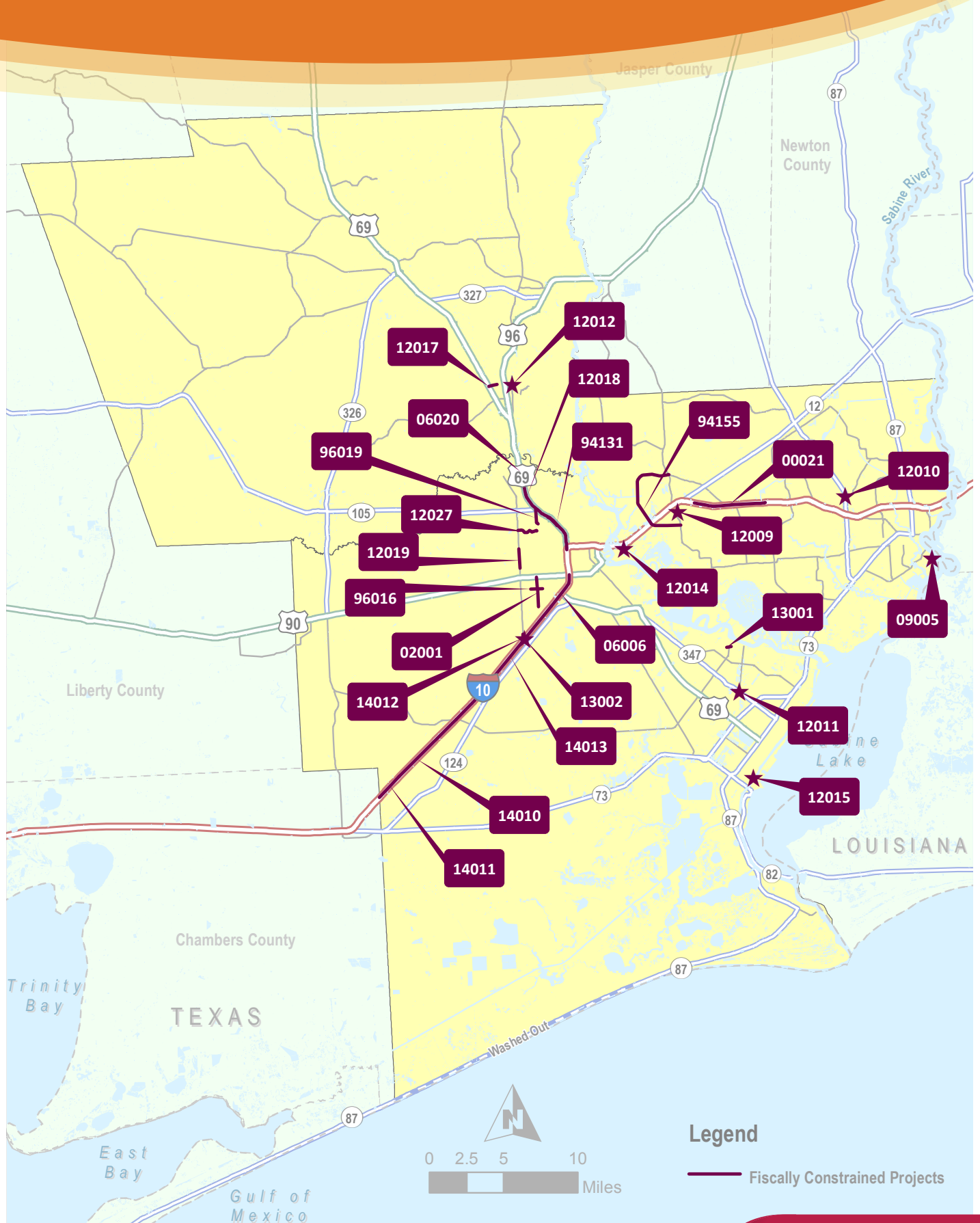

The Jefferson-Orange-Hardin Regional Transportation Study area Metropolitan Transportation Plan (JOHRTS MTP) aims to improve mobility for the three-county region by promoting an efficient, effective, and multimodal transportation system that optimizes existing finances, protects the environment, and provides a net social benefit to users.

The JOHRTS MTP is the official multimodal transportation plan for the JOHRTS area and address no less than a 20-year planning horizon. Transportation plans require developing goals and objectives that reflect regional values and satisfy long-term regional transportation needs. The regional transportation goals include:

- Preserve and Maintain the Existing Transportation System
- Improve the Operational Efficiency of the Transportation Network
- Enhance the Safety of the Transportation Community
- Enhance the Security of the Transportation Community
- Protect and Improve the Environment
- Maximize the Social Benefits of the Transportation System
- Foster Economic Development
- Maintain Financial Responsibility in the Development and Preservation of the Transportation System

The JOHRTS MTP identifies projects and programs that will meet regional goals and accommodate the future needs of the three-county region. In addition, the JOHRTS MTP underscores the vital role that transportation plays in the social, environmental, and economic health of the area.

declined for the average patient with private health insurance.

"The cost has to be looked at relative to the outcomes," said Dr. Ashok Malani, a medical oncologist at Baptist Hospitals of Southeast Texas.

Early diagnosis is key in reducing costs as the cancer can be treated more effectively in a short amount of time, said Todd Senters, service line administrator at Baptist Hospitals of Southeast Texas Cancer Center.

Breast cancer, especially, is being treated quickly and effectively with more women, like Cross, getting mammograms, Senters said.

Cross received a personalized treatment, a plan specific to her cancer.

More doctors are using personalized methods that allow patients to continue to go to work while obtaining treatment, Malani said. Chemotherapy drugs are

given on a case-by-case basis and in pill form.

Radiation is likely to be fitted to the tumor, Senters said.

Dr. April Mensah, the radiation oncology medical director at Baptist Hos-

pitals of Southeast Texas Cancer Center, makes three dimensional models of a tumor so the radia-

tion only treats the tumor and leaves the healthy surrounding tissue.

But some of these treatments are new, and insurance companies are reluctant to cover the cost.

Cross decided with her doctor to use the SAVI applicator, a high intensity radiation therapy that targets the tissue where the tumor is most likely to recur. It has fewer side effects.

When the insurance company didn't initially cover the cost of the applicator, her doctor had to provide statistical data showing the success rate the applicator has had in just eight years, she said.

Senters said the cost is also reduced when cancer patients use outpatient centers instead of going to large hospitals for cancer detected in early stages.

Mensah said that it's the brand name facilities that patients are attracted to, but national guidelines are followed at every cancer center, and the treatment should essentially be the

same. "Sometimes we do have to say 'no' because the cost burden will be too high," Senters said, noting that the patients would be referred to another resource.

With early detection, doctors are mostly likely to rid the patient of the cancer the first time they treat it. "It used to be a guessing game," Senters said. "Now we're able to get it right the first time."

Senters said the cancer center understands the high cost of these treatments, and treatable patients won't be turned away despite the ability to pay. The cancer center has payment plans and other resources that are available to ensure each patient gets the treatment they need.

"These patients did not ask for this diagnosis. They did not ask for this disease," Senters said. "And it doesn't always come at the most convenient time."
